Jennifer Manganello is an Associate Professor at the University at Albany School of Public Health. She is a health communication scholar who incorporates theories, concepts, and methods from both the fields of public health and communication. Her research focuses on health literacy as well as the effects of media on attitudes, behaviors, and policies that put young people (children, adolescents, young adults) at risk for negative health outcomes. She has published her work in journals such as the *Journal of Health Communication*, *Archives of Pediatrics and Adolescent Medicine*, and *Public Health Nutrition*. Before starting at UAlbany, Dr. Manganello was a Post-Doctoral Research Fellow at the University of Pennsylvania Annenberg School for Communication, Annenberg Public Policy Center and earned her Ph.D. from the Department of Health Policy and Management at the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health.
