His research broadly examines how social inequalities in health emerge over the life course. He has written on the connection between social inequalities and cancer, suicide, health, and aging. Currently his research focuses on examining the influence of socioeconomic factors over the life course as determinants of cognitive and physical aging and diseases later in life. Dr. Clouston's work is funded by the NIA (P01 AG043362).
