Title: Climate-related disasters in Latin America: Lessons from DesInventar

In poor countries, few efforts have been made to document in a spatially-specific way where extreme-event disasters have occurred, and to analyze harm in relation to populations at risk. This talk summarizes evidence from the remarkable DesInventar project on disasters in Latin America from the late 1980s to the present, focusing on the effects of floods, landslides, and drought across the region, using datasets for 12 countries. A critique of the DesInventar method is presented with an eye to improving disaster risk monitoring for the Sustainable Development Goals and the follow-on to the Hyogo Framework for Action.
